Albert Einstein was born in Germany on March 14, 1870. He attended elementary school in Munich but he didn't like it very much. He wasn't a good reader, and spelling was difficult for him. Albert Einstein didn't learn to read until he was nine. Other students said young Albert was unsociable. In fact, Albert Einstein found most school subjects boring. However, he was passionate about maths and science. He left school at the age of fifteen.

In 1895, Einstein's family moved to Switzerland and he began to study again. He finally completed his studies in 1900.

Einstein was a scientific genius. By 1920, he was famous around the world. He won the Nobel Prize for Physics in 1921.
